[New] Plato's Sophist. Selected Papers of the Thirteenth Symposium Platonicum. Herausgegeben von Edward C. Halper, Luc Brisson, Richard D. Parry. (International Plato Studies, 42)\* 2024. 558 pages. (Hb.) ¥35,002

The articles in this volume are a selection of the papers presented during the Symposium Platonicum XIII held, 18-22 July 2022, at the University of Georgia, Athens, GA. The topic of the Symposium was Plato's Sophist. Internationally known scholars, representing a variety of traditions and perspectives, have contributed works focused on many aspects of this work. The richness of the dialogue is addressed under the following headings: Philosophers and Sophists, The Method of Division, Eleatic Stranger and Noble Sophist, Dynamis and Being, Being and Non-Being, Kinds, Truth and Falsehood, Before and After the Sophist.

Plato's Parmenides. Selected Papers of the Twelfth Symposium Platonicum. Edited by Prof. Dr. Luc Brisson, Dr. Arnaud Macé, Dr. Olivier Renaut. (International Plato Studies, 41) 2022. 568 pages. (Hb.) ¥28,919

This volume brings together a selection of papers presented at the Platonicum XII Symposium on Plato's Parmenides, held in Paris from 15 to 19 July 2019. The volume contains fifty contributions that testify to the vitality and diversity of Platonic scholarship on this difficult dialogue. It is divided into six sections that offer a path through the dialogue according to its most important articulations:

- I. On the threshold of Parmenides
- II Parmenides in context
- III Dialogue, dialectic, exercises
- IV. The theory of forms
- V. The hypotheses
- VI Parmenides and his reception

Plato's *Phaedo*. Selected Papers from the Eleventh Symposium Platonicum. Edited by Prof. Gabriele Cornelli, Prof. Thomas Robinson, Prof. Dr. Francisco Bravo. (International Plato Studies, 38) 2019. 407 pages. (Hb.) ¥16,764

The enclosed Proceedings are a selection, by 41 of the Society's scholars, of the papers presented at the Eleventh Symposium Platonicum of the International Plato Society, held in Brasilia, Brazil, under the auspices of the University of Brasilia. The volume covers all major issues related to the interpretation of Plato's *Phaedo* and the reception of this central dialogue throughout Antiquity.

Six main chapters examine different aspects concerning the dialogue, starting with its structure, moving on to topics of Myth, Emotion and Virtues. Special focus is laid on the *Phaedo*'s core issue: The soul and the images of afterlife and immortality. Chapter five then moves on to the manifestation of specific argumental structures. The book concludes with a focus on historiographical content, Socrates as depicted in the *Phaedo*.

Plato in Symposium. Selected Papers from the Tenth Symposium Platonicum. Edited by Mauro Tulli and Michael Erler. (International Plato Studies, 35) 2016. xii,529 pages. (Hb.) ¥17,985

The articles in this volume are a selection of the papers presented at the Tenth Symposium Platonicum of the International Plato Society held at Pisa in July 2013, under the auspices of the University of Pisa, the Ministero dell'Istruzione, dell'Università e della Ricerca, and the President of the Italian Republic. The volume gives important contribution in interpreting the philosophical and philological problems that the Symposium raises and testifies to the wide range of different approaches to Plato's dialogues in modern scholarship. Dialogues on Plato's *Politeia* (Republic). Selected Papers from the Ninth Symposium Platonicum. Edited by Noburu Notomi and Luc Brisson. (International Plato Studies, 31) 2013. xi,415 pages. (Hb.) ¥14,091

This volume comprises a selection of the articles delivered at the Ninth Symposium Platonicum of the International Plato Society, held in Tokyo. The articles cover a variety of chief issues raised in Plato's *Politeia* (Republic), including philology, ethics, political philosophy, psychology, epistemology, metaphysics, education and aesthetics, together with its reception history. The volume reconsiders the recent achievements and provides new perspectives on this most important dialogue.

Plato's *Laws*. From Theory into Practice. Proceedings of the VI Symposium Platonicum. Edited by Samuel Scolnicov and Luc Brisson. (International Plato Studies, 15) 2003. viii,368 pages. (Hb.) ¥13,970

The articles in this volume are a selection of the papers presented at the Sixth Symposium Platonicum of the International Plato Society in Jerusalem. They reflect the breadth of topics and the range of problems present in Plato's *Laws*: Problems of editing and literary form, rhetoric and style, Homeric quotations; the Socratic influence; soul and motion; pleasure, virtue and happiness, ethics and education, gender; public offices, economics, and philosophy of history; political philosophy and religion. Addressed are also the historical and literary contexts of the *Laws*, and its later repercussions. The volume includes a unified Bibliography, an Index locorum and a Subject Index.

Plato: *Euthydemus*, *Lysis*, *Charmides*. Proceedings of the Fifth Symposium Platonicum Selected Papers. Edited by Thomas M. Robinson, Luc Brisson. (International Plato Studies, 13) 2000. vii,402 pages. (Hb.) ¥13,728

This volume contains a selection of papers read at the Fifth Symposium Platonicum, Toronto. It contains an Index Locorum, a Subject Index and a consolidated Bibliography. The three dialogues discussed at the Symposium drew papers from scholars all over the world, including some who have produced editions and translations of one or other of them in recent years, such as Rosamond Kent Sprague ('The Euthydemus Revisited'), Louis-André Dorion ('Euthydème et Dionysodore sont-ils des Mégariques?'), Michel Narcy ('Le Socrate du Lysis est-il un sophiste?') and Michael Bordt, S.J. ('The Unity of Plato's Lysis'). Among other widely known symposiasts whose papers are included in the volume are Charles H. Kahn ('Some Puzzles in the Euthydemus'), Christopher Gill ('Protreptic and Dialectic in Plato's Euthydemus'), Christopher Rowe ('The Lysis and Symposium: aporia and euporia?'), Matthias Baltes ('Zum Status der Ideen in Platons Frühdialogen Charmides, Euthydemus, Lysis'), Thomas Alexander Szlezák ('Die Handlung der Dialoge Charmides und Euthydemus'), and Thomas C. Brickhouse and Nicholas D. Smith ('Making Things Good and Making Good Things in Socratic Philosophy'). In view of the amount of interest shown in these less often read dialogues in recent years, the appearance of this volume, in which they are examined from a multiplicity of angles, philological and philosophical, and through a variety of traditions of interpretation, is especially timely.

Interpreting the <Timaeus> - <Critias>. Proceedings of the IV Symposium Platonicum. Selected Papers. Edited by Thomàs Calvo, Luc Brisson. (International Plato Studies, 09) 1997. 378 pages. (Hb.) ¥11,902

The IVth Symposium Platonicum was entirely given over to a study of Plato's Timaeus and Critias.

The papers published here deal both with more traditional problems of interpretation - whether or not the universe had a beginning in time, the status of the demiurge, the relation between the Timaeus and the Critias - and with a range of questions less frequently discussed, i.e. the treatment in the Timaeus of mathematics, of cosmic providence, sense-perception, medicine, the relation between soul and body, the literary genre of the Critias, the political project of the two dialogues.

Reading the Statesman. Proceedings of the Third symposium Platonicum, Bristol 1992. Edited by Christopher J.Rowe. (International Plato Studies, 04) 1995. 424 pages. (Hb.) Not available

Understanding the Phaedrus. Proceedings of the Second Symposium Platonicum, Perugia. Edited by Livio Rossetti. Second edition. (International Plato Studies, 01) 2016. 348 pages. (Br.) ¥11,902

The Phaedrus is widely used as a text on which to try out new lines of interpretation. Hence the choice of this dialogue as sole topic of the 'Second Symposium Platonicum'. Discussions at the Symposium led to the exploration and evaluation of various ways of interpreting the dialogue, both traditional and innovatory.

A generous selection of papers is included in the Proceedings. The section-headings include: relative chronology, rhetoric, 'philosophy' and 'dialectic' in the Phaedrus; truth and limitations of writing; eros; soul and body; the Phaedrus and Plato's contemporaries'; philosophy and politics; the later reception of the Phaedrus.

An Index was added to this second edition.
